The lack of recognised professional profiles, specialised training and reliable certification systems limits real impact.


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FROM LEGISLATION TO PRACTICE

The European Accessibility Act highlights the need for professionals capable of implementing and assessing accessibility in physical and digital environments.

Without structured training and certification, accessibility remains uneven and fragmented. AccessCoVE promotes a coordinated European approach connecting education, public authorities and companies.

NEW ACCESSIBILITY PROFILES



AccessCoVE is working on the definition of two complementary professional profiles:

Accessibility Consultant: Identifies barriers and supports the implementation of accessibility solutions.

Accessibility Certifier: Assesses compliance with standards and ensures quality and trust. Together, these profiles strengthen the professionalisation and impact of accessibility across Europe.

SOCIAL DIALOGUE MATTERS

More than 50 representatives from public authorities, companies, education providers and international organisations participated in AccessCoVE focus groups.

The conclusion is clear: accessibility advances through structured dialogue, cross-sector cooperation and the active involvement of persons with disabilities.



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
